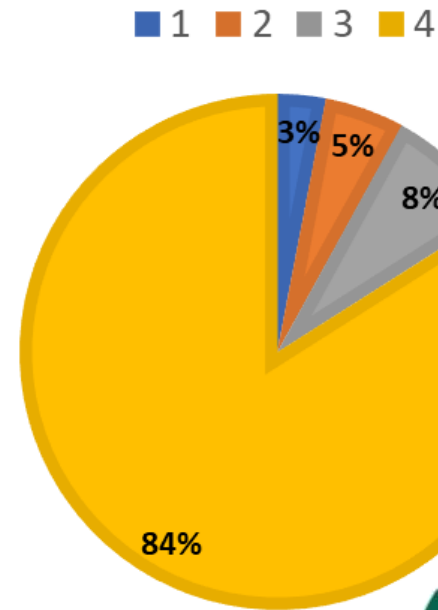


Mobile Phone Consultation – March 2024

1. No mobile phones on the school premises - they must be left at home or with parents / carers	48

Staff	<p>There is a big shift towards using online systems/apps, so this would be a big impact/backwards step – 32</p> <p>Clear rules would be needed – 3</p> <p>Sixth Form should have different rules – 3</p> <p>Some departments need/use phones as part of lessons – would need a mass stock of tablets to replace – 2</p> <p>Would need clear rules/sanctions – 1</p> <p>Smart watches? – 1</p>
Students (Years 7-11)	<p>Some subjects need/rely on using phones – 121</p> <p>Students use phones to access Teams/Arbor, etc. – 44</p> <p>EAL students need phones to translate – 1</p>
Sixth Form	<p>Phones are used in many lessons to aid learning – 108</p> <p>Need to use phones to check Teams/Arbor/emails, etc. – 54</p> <p>Students use phones for revision/research – 52</p> <p>Phones vital in PS – 37</p> <p>Without phones, costs of printing resources would increase – 11</p> <p>School lacks decent Wifi/IT – 10</p> <p>Sixth Form students are more responsible and should be allowed to use phones – 8</p> <p>Students use phones to organise themselves – 3</p> <p>Sixth Formers use group chats for subjects – 1</p>

Staff	<p>Safe spaces needed for certain students to use phones – 6 Banning phones would reduce social media conflicts – 5 Negative impact on staff having to enforce – 4 Ban would improve interpersonal skills and reduce reliance on parents – 4 Some students would need phones for medical reasons – 2 Sixth Form should have different rules – 2 Young carers would need access to phones – 2 Could we have safe areas to use phones at lunch/break? - 2 No phones would improve wellbeing Students would need activities to replace phone use – 1</p>
Students (Years 7-11)	<p>Students use phones to contact parents/friends when needed – 51 Students use phones to distress – 31 Students use apps for wellbeing – 13 Some students don't have friends and use phone as substitute – 10 Some students need phones for medical reasons – 9</p>
Sixth Form	<p>Students use phones to contact friends/parents for support – 59 Students use phones to distress – 49 Some students don't have many friends, so use phones as substitute – 18 Banning phones won't stop cyberbullying – 10 Phone ban would increase anxiety for some students - 7 Some students use apps for mental health support – 6 Sixth Formers use phones to pay for food – 5 Some students need phones for medical reasons – 3 Phone ban would negatively impact students' ability to stay organised – 2 Young carers need phone access – 2</p>

Parents and Carers

Students use phones to contact parents/friends when there are problems – 154
 Phones are bad for mental health – 95
 Students need to be educated about dangers/responsible use of mobile phones - 39
 Some students use phones to destress - 29
 Some students use mental health apps – 27
 Ban/handling phones in would create additional anxieties – 22
 Some students need phones for medical reasons - 16
 Phones are an important part of modern life and therefore have a place in schools - 15
 Some students don't have many friends and use phone as substitute – 14
 Some students use phones as part of socialising – 7
 Alternative activities need to be provided for lunch/break – 6
 There need to be different policies for different age groups – 3
 There needs to be better face-to-face support for students at school – 2

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Prefect Feedback

Complete ban:

- Fewer distractions
- Makes revision more difficult
- Students need to be able to contact parents
- Students need phones for journey to/from school

Secure/handed in:

- Concerns about how secure this would be
- What would happen if a phone was lost or damaged?
- Students may hand in an 'old' phone and keep their actual phone
- This might cause additional anxiety for some students
- Process would be very time-consuming

Phones in bags:

- Need phones to contact home
- Sixth Form should have different rules

Other:

- Phones are not the issue – it's the people using them
- Unfair that Year 7 and KS5 are treated the same
- Increase in cost of producing resources
- Many subjects use phones in lessons
- Students might end up using phones in toilets
- Cost of providing laptops/tablets for use in lessons
- Some students use phones to destress
- Young carers need phone access
- What about smart watches?
