In this new section we will take the time to celebrate an area we excel at here at Hinchingbrooke. This week we will focus on Science!

Did you know...

Our Science Department gets significantly above national results year in year out? The number of students achieving Triple Science each year is also on the increase, and above the national average. Progress across the school is 0.47 (so students on average get nearly half a grade better than expected). When we compare this to Cambridge Academy for Science and Technology (CAST) who get 0.28, you can see we are really doing very well.

A Level results are great too! We achieved the second highest results in Cambridgeshire overall and well above national results in each of the separate Sciences. We run BTEC Science as well, and these results are also impressive.

We are so lucky to have a first-rate Science Department!
