## Christmas Holiday Voucher Scheme-Cambridgeshire County Council

Following the announcement that the Household Support Fund has been extended, Cambridgeshire County Council will be running a holiday voucher scheme for the Christmas holiday. For each eligible pupil, we will be issuing a £30 supermarket voucher. Eligibility remains the same as in previous rounds, including support for Post 16 bursary students. Every eligible pupil's parent/carer will receive their voucher by the end of the day on Saturday 21 December.



## The Scholars Edge Programme

The **Scholars Edge programme** is another programme developed by the Pupil Premium Team and launched with a joint group of **Year 7 and Year 8s**.

The purpose for this programme is to teach the students life skills in **leadership**, **organisation**, **resilience**, **initiative** and **communication** in bite-size sessions during morning form time.

In addition to these sessions students are given a personal challenge of completing 5 activities designed to create a feeling of community as well as a sense of pride and achievement.





## **Boxing Futures**


Boxing Futures believe changing lives through non-contact boxing and therapeutic talk sessions will help young people develop their physical and mental health.

They have been working with a group of Year 8 and Year 10 students once a week for 12 weeks to improve resilience, self-belief and confidence.

We are so lucky to have our 2 academic mentors working with us on a daily basis. Mr Nunn and Mrs Buckley are coaches to many of our pupil premium students. The Small Steps Programme sees them both working with Year 11 students to identify barriers to learning and then use a coaching approach to help these students to bring about their own positive change. This often relates to attendance, punctuality, motivation and organisational skills. Both regularly drop in on their small steps students to give them the boost to help make a difference.

Using GCSEPod regularly (learning content, self-quizzing and completing assignments) has proven to help students achieve one grade higher on average than non-users. The content is split into manageable 5-minute chunks and covers all of our GCSEs here at Hinchingbrooke

Last academic year we were the pod games national champions. The new games begin in January so we have a title to defend! All our Year 7 students have been brought up to speed on podding and all the other year groups already have experience. We need your help to encourage your children to work a pod or two into their daily homework schedule to keep them motivated to keep refreshing their knowledge on topics they have learnt. This will stand them in good stead when they eventually reach their GCSE's, and they will know exactly how to use GCSEpod and their revision will come naturally.


